

In this accessible book, Wright sets the concept of salvation in its biblical context, showing its global implications for how God's redeemed people relate to one another and the world they inhabit. *Salvation Belongs to Our God* also includes discussion questions, making it ideal for classroom use, group study or individual reflection.

Christopher J. H. Wright (Ph.D., Old Testament ethics, Cambridge) was born in Belfast, Northern Ireland. He taught Old Testament in India for five years (1983-1988) at Union Biblical Seminary before returning to the faculty of All Nations Christian College, a missionary training school in England, where he was principal from 1993-2001.

Currently Wright serves as the international director of the Langham Partnership International, the parent organization of John Stott Ministries. Wright's previous books include *The Mission of God: Unlocking the Bible's Grand Narrative* (2007 Winner, *Christianity Today* Awards, Missions/Global Affairs Category), *Knowing God the Father Through the Old Testament, Knowing Jesus Through the Old Testament, Knowing the Holy Spirit Through the Old Testament, Old Testament Ethics for the People of God and The Message of Ezekiel*.

About the Series

The Christian Doctrine in Global Perspective series is published by a partnership between Langham Literature and InterVarsity Press (Langham Literature is a program of the Langham Partnership International). The vision for the series has arisen from the knowledge that during the twentieth century a dramatic shift in the Christian center of gravity took place. There are now many more Christians in Africa, Asia and Latin America than there are in Europe and North America. Two major issues have resulted, both of which Christian Doctrine in Global Perspective seeks to address.

First, the basic theological texts available to pastors, students and lay readers in the southern hemisphere have for too long been written by Western authors from a Western perspective. What is needed now are more books by non-Western writers that reflect their own cultures. In consequence, this series has an international authorship, and we thank God that he has raised up so many gifted writers from the developing world whose resolve is to be both biblically faithful and contextually relevant. Second, what is needed is that non-Western authors will write not only for non-Western readers, but for Western readers as well. Indeed, the adjective *global* is intended to express our desire that biblical understanding will flow freely in all directions.


