

Saint Nicholas and the Story Behind Christmas Gifts

What inspired you to write Saint Nicholas the Giftgiver?

Ned Bustard: Growing up I was always enchanted by Santa Claus. In fact, I held firmly on to my belief in him at least a year longer than my younger sister. I remember dressing up as Santa to distribute gifts at my cousin's home and can picture to this day me drawing the castle of Saint Nick at the North Pole as I sat by the fireplace.

Over twenty-five years ago I created a faux woodcut illustration of Santa Claus for one of my clients that somehow tapped into the deep myths I had cherished in my heart over the years in a way that the Coca-Cola and Rankin/Bass Productions' Santas could not. But my illustration by itself wouldn't have started me—or kept me—working on this book for over two decades. This book was birthed out of the combination of fatherhood and a question: How does Santa Claus give out all those gifts around the world in only one night?

When my wife and I began raising our children, I wanted to have a way to focus on Christ during the Christmas season while still having fun celebrating the arrival of Saint Nicholas. I wanted a way to teach the truth and enjoy the legends—while not confusing which was which. But how could I make Advent both magical and meaningful?

The Santa at the mall with his elves and reindeer often distract us all too much for us to focus on the birth of a poor boy long ago on a silent night. For me the path lay beyond Kris Kringle to the early history of the church. By focusing on the life of Saint Nicholas of Myra, I could encourage my children to love Saint Nick for his goodness and desire to share the love of Christ with the world rather than fixating on the jolly old elf who gives us stuff.

What is at the heart of this book?

Ned: My book embraces both the truth and the legends swirling around Bishop Nicholas to form a fresh story that is historical, theological, and magical. My illustrations are all hand-carved block prints to give the book a rooted, historic feeling. Fantastic yet grounded in reality, *Saint Nicholas the Giftgiver* is a brand new-old story that features a jolly old man with a sack of gifts he carries on his back, but it centers on the greatest giftgiver . . . and his amazing gift of his Son, Jesus Christ.

What do you hope readers take away from Saint Nicholas the Giftgiver?

Ned: Christmas is about Jesus. Saint Nicholas was a real person who loved Jesus, served the church, and was generous. We can have fun with the magic and legends about Saint Nick without sacrificing the truths of his life and the centrality of Christ. All the people around the world can get presents all in one night because time has stopped for Saint Nick, and he just walks/flies around giving generously out of his wondrous bag.

Ned is an elder at Wheatland Presbyterian Church, creative director for Square Halo Books, Inc., curator of the Square Halo Gallery, designer for Christians in the Visual Arts (CIVA), and serves on the boards of the Association of Scholars of Christianity in the History of Art (ASCHA) and The Row House, Inc. He has lectured at colleges, schools, churches, conferences, and bars.

Ned grew up in the Philadelphia area and spent summers on the Chesapeake Bay but now lives in the West End of Lancaster, Pennsylvania—much too far inland for him to get to go sailing. He and his wife, Leslie, have three daughters, one dog, and own an unreasonable amount of books.
