Timothy Paul Jones and Jamaal Williams on Multiethnic Churches as Apologetics for the Gospel

Timothy Paul Jones serves as the C. Edwin Gheens Professor of Christian Ministry, vice president for doctoral studies, and chair of the department of apologetics, ethics, and philosophy at The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary. Dr. Jones also serves as one of the pastors at the Midtown congregation of Sojourn Church in Louisville.

Jones has authored or contributed to more than twenty books in the fields of apologetics and family ministry, including Why Should I Trust the Bible?, Perspectives on Family Ministry, and the CBA bestseller The Da Vinci Codebreaker. His apologetics book How We Got the Bible received a Gold Medallion Christian Book Award in the Bible Reference category, awarded by the Evangelical Christian Publishing Association. Christian Retailing Magazine also awarded Jones the Book of the Year Award in the Christian Education category for Christian History Made Easy.

The son of a rural pastor Jones earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in biblical studies at Manhattan Christian College. He also holds the Master of Divinity degree from Midwestern Baptist Theological Seminary and the Doctor of Philosophy degree from The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary. He has taught biblical Greek at Midwestern Baptist Theological Seminary and at Oklahoma Baptist University, as well as lecturing on the reliability of the New Testament Gospels at the University of North Carolina (Chapel Hill) at forums sponsored by InterVarsity Christian Fellowship. Dr. Jones has been interviewed on numerous radio and television programs, including WGN Morning News, Fox & Friends, Crosstalk America, and Bible Answer Man. He also cohosts a popular apologetics program, Three Chords and the Truth: The Apologetics Podcast.

Jamaal Williams (DEdMin) serves as lead pastor of Sojourn Church Midtown in Louisville, Kentucky, and as president of the Harbor Network. He has developed an internship model for pastors of African American churches and written articles for The Gospel Coalition and Focus on the Family.

In 2006, while attending Michigan State University and worshiping at Faith Fellowship Baptist Church, Williams accepted God's call to preach. At FFBC, he served as associate pastor and as a leader in the church's youth and college ministry. He also served as the student president in a local chapter of InterVarsity Christian Fellowship. After college, Williams moved to Louisville to attend The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary where he received his MA from the Billy Graham School of Missions in 2014 and his doctorate (DEdMin) in Black Church Leadership in 2018.

In Louisville, Williams joined Forest Baptist Church, an African American church more than 150 years old. He first served as the young adult pastor and then as lead pastor from 2008 to 2015. In 2016 he accepted the call to become lead pastor of Sojourn Midtown, a growing multicultural, multigenerational church.
