Now with David Heiliger, in this revised and expanded edition David A. Anderson revives the biblical model for showing special grace to others on the basis of ethnicity, class, or social distinction—one of gracism. Responding to ongoing problems of prejudice and injustice, the original seven sayings of the gracist now become eight with a new chapter alongside a revised conclusion.

**Dr. David A. Anderson**, founder and president of Gracism Global (formerly the BridgeLeader Network), is one of the world's leading authorities on building bridges across the deep divides of race, faith, culture, and wealth. His global work has brought hope and healing to communities, families, and people in Africa, Asia, Europe, the Middle East, and North America, including work in Ferguson, Missouri, and Baltimore, Maryland, during recent civil unrest around issues of race and police brutality.

Anderson has appeared on ABC, CNN, FOX, BET, TBN, and C-SPAN television networks and has been interviewed on more than two thousand radio stations worldwide. He is also the host of the daily radio talk show Real Talk with Dr. David Anderson on WAVA (105.1 FM).

Anderson earned his Doctor of Letters (DLitt) degree in 2021 from Omega Graduate School and his Doctor of Philosophy (DPhil) degree in 2001 from Oxford Graduate School's American Centre for Religion and Society Studies in the US, while studying and defending his essays at Oxford University in England. Anderson currently serves as the Chancellor of Omega Graduate School (formerly Oxford Graduate School). Anderson received his bachelor's and master's degrees from the Moody Bible Institute.

As the founder and senior pastor of Bridgeway Community Church located in Columbia, Maryland, and Owings Mills/Reisterstown, Maryland, Anderson reaches a dynamic, multicultural congregation of over five thousand weekly attendees on two campuses from more than sixty different nations, and their services are viewed online in more than one hundred countries.

Anderson is the author of several books on race and diversity, including Letters Across the Divide (Baker, 2001) and Multicultural Ministry (Zondervan, 2004), the award-winning Gracism: The Art of Inclusion (IVP, 2007), and I Forgrace You: Doing Good to Those Who Have Hurt You (IVP, 2011). In 2010, Dr. Anderson edited and co-authored Multicultural Ministry Handbook: Creatively Connecting to a Diverse World (IVP, 2010).
